## Peace in Colour 40 Years in the Community






## **About This Event**

Designed in 1984 by the legendary muralist Ray Walker - a pioneer of London's socialist mural movement, it was painted after his death at the tragically early age of 39 by Mick Jones and Ray's wife Anna. The mural is recognised as one of the five iconic London murals and is a bold vision of peace, solidarity, and resistance.

With creative workshops, music, exhibitions, and a vibrant street party, the event will honour Ray Walker's legacy, reflect on Hackney's activist history, and spotlight its richly diverse communities.

To mark its 40th anniversary, a programme of celebratory events is being organised in partnership with Hackney Council and local community groups.





Highlights include an exhibition and talk at Hackney Archives, exploring the mural's creation through original sketches and photographs, and a series of creative workshops at Dalston Curve Garden.
