Black History Season Launch: CLR James Annual Lecture 'Made In Hackney'





About This Event

Juliet Coley is a second-generation Windrush resident who grew up on Hackney's Pembury Estate in the 1970s. This period instilled in her a strong sense of community, and she remains close with friends from that time.

Passionate about the representation of Black characters in literature, Coley is a leading publisher of Black children's books, with 30 written by Black children. She founded The Children's Black Book Fair UK and launched UNSUNG KidsZine, an online magazine for young Black authors.





Still a Hackney resident and youth advocate, Coley will share her story at an event hosted by music industry veteran Paulette Long OBE. The event's theme, "Standing Firm in Power and Pride," celebrates the contributions of Black people and looks toward a future of empowerment and unity.
